

State and local government organizations communicate by cellular or land-line networks shared with the public. Should those networks become overloaded due to high call volumes or other impairment (weather, civil unrest, terrorism, etc.), government personnel and locations may not be able to communicate at a critical moment. The Government Telecommunications Services (GETS), Wireless Priority Services (WPS), and **Telecommunications** Service Priority (TSP) can be valuable assets in an emergency.






